How happy will that moment be when our soul's longing is fulfilled and we enter: *the state of supreme and definitive happiness, the goal of the deepest longings of humanity.* (Fr. John Speekman)

**Pope Francis canonizes  
Junipero Serra**

Canonizing the 18th-century Spanish missionary, Blessed Junipero Serra, Pope Francis insisted a person's faith is alive only when it is shared.

The ceremony to name a new Catholic saint, the first to take place on U.S. soil, came nearly 250 years after the Spanish Franciscan friar redefined the culture and history of the far West.

Celebrating a late afternoon Mass outside the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Sept. 23, the pope declared the holiness of St. Junipero, founder of a string of missions in California.
