
DON'T FORGET THE FOOD PANTRY!

Humidify Your Home

As we batten down the hatches against the bitter sting of winter's cold and wind we create a cozy and warm home. At this we can also create a dry and unhealthy environment. We've all experienced the effects of dry air - static cling, that familiar zap you get when touching something after walking across the carpeted floor, or the occasional nosebleed. Humidification can help reduce these problems. A humidity level of 40-60% is recommended. Most of us will find 40-50% makes the house feel warmer and more comfortable. Humidity also reduces viral activity and minimizes the risk of infection. Modern home heating units have built-in humidification. We all remember the humidifier that mother would put in our bedroom when we had a bad cold. This helped to keep nasal secretions loose, making it easier for the sick child to breathe. Room humidifiers can also make any room more comfortable to be in.

ARE YOU REALLY A REGISTERED PARISHIONER?



LENT!

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd and ends with Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6th. Mark your calendars now to take advantage of the many Lenten opportunities to help prepare yourself spiritually for the Triduum and Easter Season.

- Ash Wednesday (February 22nd): Mass with distribution of Ashes will be held at 12:10 pm in St. Mary's Church and 6:00 pm in Holy Child Church.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation:
 - * During Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on First Fridays and First Saturdays
 - * During The Light is ON for You on Mondays during Lent from 5:30-7:00 pm in Holy Child Church (Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be held during The Light is ON for You)
 - * 2:30-3:00 pm on Saturdays in Holy Child Church.
 - * Communal Penance Services:
 - ♦ Sunday, March 19th, 3:00 pm, St. Peter's Church, Wellsboro
 - ♦ Sunday, March 26th, 3:00 pm, Holy Child Church, Mansfield
 - * By appointment (call the parish office)
- Stations of the Cross: The schedule is:
 - * Following the Thursday 6 pm Mass in Holy Child Church on February 23rd and March 2nd & 9th.
 - * 3:30 pm in Holy Child Church, followed by a Meager Meal in the church hall, on February 24th, March 3rd and March 10th.
 - * 3:30 pm in St. Mary's Church, followed by a Meager Meal in the church hall, on March 17th, March 24th and March 31st.
- Fasting and Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (to abstain from eating meat).
 - * For Roman Catholics, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
 - * The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Roman Catholics from age 14 onwards.
- There will be a Community Lenten observance at noon in the Baptist Church on Thursdays during Lent. On February 23rd Holy Child will provide the refreshments.
- Adult Education: Lectio: The Case for Jesus. Beginning Sunday, February 26th in Holy Child Hall following the 11:15 am Mass. Do you follow Jesus 'on the way'? Can we trust the Gospels? Do we really know who wrote them? Do the Gospels communicate truth or fabricated fables? Who is Jesus? Who did Jesus claim to be? Join Dr. Brant Pitre as he draws evidence from both early Christian and non-Christian writings attesting to the authenticity, authorship, and dating of the Gospels, and as he gives an in-depth look at the Gospel accounts of Jesus's Crucifixion, Resurrection, and the proclamation of Christ's divinity.
