GUIDE TO CONFESSION

BEFORE CONFESSION

Confession can seem intimidating for a lot of people, but with some simple preparation, it can be a healing encounter with Christ that will leave you filled with peace.

Pray: Pray that God will give you peace and help you make a good confession.

A Prayer Before Confession

Dear Jesus, help me to make a good Confession, Help me to find out my sins, Help me to be sorry for them, Have mercy on me, O Lord, and forgive me.

Mary, my mother, pray for me.

Reflect: Reflect on ways you have harmed your relationship with God, yourself & others. Consider using an Examination of Conscience to reflect in preparation for your confes-

DURING CONFESSION

Greeting: The priest will welcome you; he may say a short blessing or read a Scripture passage.

Sign of the Cross: Together, you and the priest will make the Sign of the Cross. You may then begin your confession with these or similar words: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (give weeks, months, or years) since my last confession."

Confession: Confess all your sins aloud to the priest, who listens lovingly on behalf of Christ & the Church. If you are unsure what to say, ask the priest for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words: "I am sorry for these and all my sins."

Penance: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. He might also counsel you on how to better live a Christian life.

Act of Contrition: A simple expression to expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to leave sin behind and live more like Jesus Christ!

An Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In His name, my God, have mercy.

Absolution: The priest then blesses you in the person of Christ as he says the prayer of Absolution which frees you from your sins.

AFTER CONFESSION

Rejoice: Through the grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God has reminded you of His unending love!

Resolve: Resolve to leave sin behind and live in the Light!

Respond: Follow through with the penance the priest gave you and share the mercy you received with others.

"With the help of Your grace"

These words in an act of contrition remind you that when avoiding sin seems too difficult, you can rely on God by turning to Him in prayer and the Sacraments.

33 Days to Merciful Love By Fr. Michael E. Gaitley, MIC

33 Days to Merciful Love journeys with one of the most beloved saints of modern times, St. Therese of Lisieux, and concludes with a consecration to Divine Mercy.

St. Therese was declared a Doctor of the Church by St. John Paul II, because she had developed a specific spirituality that is recognized as something new and important for the Church. This book hones in on that spirituality, and how it connects with Divine Mercy. Therese made a consecration to Divine Mercy which she calls her Offering to Merciful Love, which is really the culmination of her whole spiritual teaching on her Little Way. Fr. Gaitley thinks this is the most powerful form of consecration to Divine Mercy, and understandably so, since it made her such a great saint in such a short time (24 yrs.).

Her Offering to Merciful Love is based on her profound insight that the Heart of Jesus is full of mercy, and he longs to pour out that Merciful Love on we sinners. Therese realized that sinners often close their hearts to the Lord's great mercy, and their rejection actually causes Jesus deep suffering. So for the purpose of consoling the Heart of Jesus, Therese asked the Lord to pour into her soul all the mercy rejected by others - and He did. That experience set her on fire with Merciful Love, so that everything she did, no matter how small, was done for love of Jesus.

So whether you want to deepen your love of Divine Mercy or have a devotion to St. Therese, 33 Days to Merciful

Love is the book to transform you.

- Fasting and Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (to abstain from eating meat).
 - * For Roman Catholics, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
 - * The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Roman Catholics from age 14 onwards.



FROM YOUR HEALTH MINISTRY

Hypertension or high blood pressure is defined as blood pressure with the systolic number (upper) greater than 140 and the diastolic number (lower) greater than 90. This needs to be a consistent reading for more than



three times. If using a home blood pressure machine, be sure the cuff is large enough for your upper arm and is in the proper position. Blood pressure machines at the pharmacy are not the most accurate. Having someone take your blood pressure with a sphygmomanometer is the most accurate.

If you are diagnosed with high blood pressure, here are some things that will help you control it: Medication adherence, decreased salt intake and regular exercise. Even a short walk to the mailbox or walking around a store (not buying anything) can help.




