May is an excellent month to learn more about our Blessed Mother. Here is a brief description of what each session of the new Lectio sessions will cover. If you are unable to attend one or more of the sessions, the videos are available on FORMED.

The New Eve | Lectio: Mary | Episode 1
The Book of Genesis begins with the story of Adam and
Eve, whose sin of disobedience breaks their relationship with
God. God does not abandon his people, but gradually prepares
them for the coming of his Son, Jesus Christ. Jesus, the promised "seed" of Genesis 3:15 is the "New Adam," and his
mother, the promised "woman," is the "New Eve."

The New Ark | Lectio: Mary | Episode 2 In the Book of Exodus, God's presence was contained in the Ark of the Covenant, his dwelling place among his Chosen People. In the New Exodus, God is once more present among his people in the Person of his Son, Jesus Christ. When Jesus is conceived in her womb, Mary becomes the New Ark of the New Covenant, bearing the presence of God.

Mother of the Messiah | Lectio: Mary | Episode 3 In the Old Testament, the prophet Isaiah prophesies about the coming Messiah and the Messiah's mother. Since Jesus the anointed one of God, who saves his people from their sin—is truly the foretold Messiah, then his mother, Mary, is truly the Mother of the Messiah.

The Queen Mother | Lectio: Mary | Episode 4 In the Old Testament, throughout the line of Davidic kings, the queen was not the wife of the king, but rather the king's mother. As a result, King Solomon placed a throne at his right hand for his queen mother and bowed down in homage to her. Jesus, as the fulfillment of the Davidic line, rules as king of heaven and earth with his mother, Mary, as the queen mother.

The Perpetual Virgin | Lectio: Mary | Episode 5 Despite being married, Mary remained a virgin her whole life. When the New Testament speaks of our Lord's brothers and sisters, a closer look at the original language spoken by Jesus, as well as other Scripture verses, sheds light on the truth of Mary's perpetual virginity.

MOTHER OF SORROWS | LECTIO: MARY | EPISODE 6
The Christian belief in the miraculous birth of Jesus affirms that Mary did not experience physical labor or birth pangs. However, as she stands at the foot of the Cross, she experiences the pain foretold by Simeon—"a sword will pierce through your own soul"—when she becomes the Mother of the Church.

THE NEW RACHEL | LECTIO: MARY | EPISODE 7
The Old Testament story of Joseph prefigures the life of Jesus and his salvific role in the New Testament. Likewise,

the life of Benjamin, Joseph's younger brother, has parallels with the life of John the beloved disciple. Rachel, the mother of Joseph and Benjamin, prefigures Mary, the mother of Jesus and spiritual mother of John, and, thus, she can be seen as the New Rachel.

QUESTION & ANSWER | LECTIO: MARY | EPISODE 8

SCIENTISTS DISCOVER CHILDREN'S CELLS LIVING IN MOTHERS' BRAINS

THE CONNECTION BETWEEN MOTHER AND CHILD IS EVEN DEEP-ER THAN THOUGHT

The link between a mother and child is profound, and new research suggests a physical connection even deeper than anyone thought. The profound psychological and physical bonds shared by the mother and her child begin during gestation when the mother is everything for the developing fetus, supplying warmth and sustenance, while her heartbeat provides a soothing constant rhythm.

The physical connection between mother and fetus is provided by the placenta, an organ, built of cells from both the mother and fetus, which serves as a conduit for the exchange of nutrients, gasses, and wastes. Cells may migrate through the placenta between the mother and the fetus, taking up residence in many organs of the body including the lung, thyroid, muscle, liver, heart, kidney and skin. These may have a broad range of impacts, from tissue repair and cancer prevention to sparking immune disorders.

We all consider our bodies to be our own unique being, so the notion that we may harbor cells from other people in our bodies seems strange. Even stranger is the thought that, although we certainly consider our actions and decisions as originating in the activity of our own individual brains, cells from other individuals are living and functioning in that complex structure. However, the mixing of cells from genetically distinct individuals is not at all uncommon. This condition is called chimerism after the fire-breathing Chimera from Greek mythology, a creature that was part serpent part lion and part goat. Naturally occurring chimeras are far less ominous though, and include such creatures as the slime mold and corals.

Microchimerism is the persistent presence of a few genetically distinct cells in an organism. This was first noticed in humans many years ago when cells containing the male "Y" chromosome were found circulating in the blood of women after pregnancy. Since these cells are genetically male, they could not have been the women's own, but most likely came from their babies during gestation.

Microchimerism most commonly results from the exchange of cells across the placenta during pregnancy...


Women may have microchimeric cells both from their mother as well as from their own pregnancies, and there is even evidence for competition between cells from grandmother and infant within the mother.



FROM YOUR HEALTH MINISTRY

Why does my doctor, my dentist, my eye doctor and any other health care provider that I go to want to know my list of medications? Why? Because 20% of people are taking supplements or other



prescription medications that may interfere with each other. Examples include blood pressure and glaucoma medication. Both are given to decrease pressure. Each medication acts in a different way but too much can cause dizziness, fainting and a dangerously low blood pressure. Another example is taking the supplement red rice yeast and cholesterol medication. This combination can cause permanent liver damage. A common potentially harmful combination is taking an NSAID (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory) with blood pressure medications. This combination hinders the effectiveness of the blood pressure medication which greatly increases the risk of stroke or heart failure. Therefore, it is important to keep a list of all products you use including prescription/ nonprescription and supplements to share with all your health care providers. But where to keep the list? One good spot is with your drivers license or on your cell phone under notes. Be sure to include all allergies - medication, food, pollens, etc. and surgeries that you have had in the past. Be sure to share your lists with a family member also.

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual wellbeing. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.



LECTIO: THE CASE FOR JESUS WITH DR. BRANT PITRE

Do you follow Jesus 'on the way'?




