
Matrimony: Couples planning to marry should contact their Pastor at least 6 months before the planned wedding date.






33 DAYS TO MERCIFUL LOVE A Consecration to Divine Mercy

All parishioners of St. Peter's, St. Thomas', St. Catherine's, Holy Child, and St. Mary's Churches are invited to participate in 33 Days to Merciful Love, a consecration to Divine Mercy that begins on Friday, April 28th, and ends on Wednesday, May 31st. Participants will receive daily emails and are encouraged to share their thoughts and prayer requests with each other.



The group will journey for 33 days in the company of St. Therese, reflecting on *What is Trust? "The Little Way,*" the *Offering to Merciful Love*, and *Into the Darkness*. FROM YOUR HEALTH MINISTRY

You have high blood pressure and are taking your medication as you should, reducing your salt intake, and exercise moderately at least 3 times a week but the numbers aren't coming down. What's wrong? Maybe nothing, but maybe a personal habit that is putting you at increased risk.



A little wine or a drink is good, but too much, even in just one sitting, can raise your blood pressure for up to three days. A good rule of thumb is one drink per day. As is often said, "Moderation is the key."

Another possibility is medication or supplements that your physician is unaware of. Medications including antiinflammatories such as Ibuprofen, Motrin, Naproxen and Aleve; decongestants containing Sudafed; or pseudoephedrine are known to increase blood pressure. Antidepressants and immunosuppressants can also make managing your blood pressure more difficult.

Every health care provider from your primary care physician, eye doctor, dentist and specialists needs a complete list of every pill you take. This includes aspirin, vitamins and other over the counter supplements. Many supplements may interfere with the effectiveness of prescription medication. Just as certain foods may cause problems - such as grapefruit with cholesterol medications.

Spiritual Adoption Program

Month Eight - Your baby is making progress developing all of his external features and internal organs. His brain is functioning at 40 days. His mother can hear his heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Baby-teeth buds are present at $6\frac{1}{2}$ weeks. And it has been reported that a two-month old baby can suck his



thumb. From this moment, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines his body. But everything he needs to survive after birth is already present by the end of the eighth week.

God, author of all life, bless, we pray, this unborn child; give constant protection and grant a healthy birth that is the sign of our rebirth one day into the eternal rejoicing of heaven. Amen. Spiritual Adoption Warriors,

continue to pray for my mother and me. For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well". - Psalm 139:13-14 (NIV)




