#### FROM YOUR HEALTH MINISTRY

Doing any yard work lately? I sure am since the recent wind storms have trimmed a lot of branches out of my trees. Thank heaven the weather has started turning nicer so we can get out and exercise by doing our yard work. See yard work is exercise. Running late to work or an appointment doesn't count! With that we need to maintain our fluid levels to avoid dehydration. But you hate the taste of plain water? Here are some suggestions to make it more palatable: add a few slices of lemon or lemon juice to your water. A tea made from boiling slices of ginger and adding to your drink will add a spark of interest. Infusions of cucumbers, strawberries, frozen grapes or any combination of fruit will add interest making it easier to stay hydrated. Sports drinks like Gatorade or Powerade are all right occasionally but remember they have a high sugar content too. So how do I tell if I'm dehydrated? Here are some early warning signs: feeling thirsty, feeling tired, dry mouth, lips, or tongue, and headache. The color and frequency of your urine is also a good indicator. Are you passing urine more than three or four times a day? Is your urine a light amber color? Clear urine can indicate over hydration and dark yellow or tea colored may mean dehydra-

## NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/</u> <u>cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual wellbeing. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

#### **SUMMERTIME DRESS**

Visitors to St. Peter's Basilica, the Sistine Chapel, or the Vatican Museums are required to abide by the official dress code, which requires that men wear long pants and shirts with at least short sleeves (no sleeveless shirts, no shorts.) Women in these locations may wear trousers, capri pants, skirts and dresses, however they cannot be shorter than knee length and shoulders must be covered. Bare shoulders and short skirts are not permitted. See *www.papalaudience.org/dress-code*. If this is the dress code at St. Peter's Basilica and the Sistine Chapel, it seems reasonable to abide by the same standards in our own church during Divine worship. By doing so, we show our respect for God as well as one another.
