

THE HIDDEN KING: THE JEWISH ROOTS OF ST. JOSEPH

What is your image of St. Joseph? A poor, humble carpenter, or the hidden King of the Jews? An elderly widower, or a man in his prime, the chaste spouse of Mary? The mere legal guardian of the child Jesus, or the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father?


In this series, Dr. Brant Pitre takes the popular figure of Saint Joseph and open up the mysteries of his hidden identity, his relationship with Mary, and his role as the earthly foster-father of Jesus. In it, you will learn about:

- How Joseph was the Hidden King of the Jews
- Why Joseph was a threat to the Fake King Herod
- Why Herod Murdered his own Wife, three Sons, and the Infants in Bethlehem
- Why Joseph Accepted Mary's Jewish Vow of Virginity
- How Joseph Hid the Virgin Birth from Satan
- Joseph's Relation to the "Brothers" of Jesus
- Apocryphal Legend of the Elderly Joseph
- The Biblical Age of Saint Joseph
- The Persecution of Joseph's Family
- How Joseph is the earthly Shadow of Jesus' heavenly Father

Many books on Saint Joseph focus on apocryphal legends and private revelations. In this Bible Study, Dr. Pitre focuses on what we can learn about Saint Joseph from the Bible, ancient Jewish and Roman history, and the living Tradition of the Church. As you will discover, although Joseph is silent in pages of the New Testament, when looked at through ancient Jewish eyes, he stands with Jesus and Mary at the very center of salvation history.

So, if you already have a devotion to Joseph, or if you just want to understand what the Bible really teaches about the man who was closest to Jesus, then this Bible Study is for you.

This Study will meet in Holy Child Hall following the 11:15 am Mass beginning on Sunday, July 30th. Due to the Parish Picnic, Parish Dinner and Labor Day, the study will not meet on August 13th, 27th or September 3.



WHY JULY IS DEDICATED TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD of CHRIST

When the pope was in exile, he turned to the Blood of Christ for strength.

One particular devotion in the Catholic Church connected to the Passion of Jesus Christ is the honoring of his Precious Blood. It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century when a universal feast was established.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood.

While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honor of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter.

On August 10 he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.

Below is the opening prayer of the votive Mass, as well as an additional prayer that can be used as our own personal meditation or prayer during July.

O God, who by the Precious Blood of your only Begotten Son have redeemed the whole world, preserve in us the work of your mercy, so that, ever honoring the mystery of our salvation, we may merit to obtain its fruits. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Admitted to your sacred table, O Lord, we have with joy drawn water from the fountains of the Savior: O may His blood, we beseech thee, become within us a fountain of water springing up to eternal life. Amen.



ADORATION IN HOLY CHILD PARISH

Holy Child Parish offers Adoration before all Masses and for an hour following Mass on First Friday and First Saturday. During these times we can silently...

- Adore Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.
- Pray a Rosary, Chaplet, or other prayer(s).
- Read Sacred Scripture.
- Pray the Liturgy of the Hours.



Because there are always other people present during Adoration in Holy Child Parish, please remain silent. If necessary, whisper a few words. For a conversation, leave the Sanctuary and wait for the door to fully close before quietly saying what you need to say. Remember that the narthex/vestibule is open to the choir loft, which is open to the Sanctuary. Maintaining silence in the Sanctuary shows reverence to the Blessed Sacrament respect for the prayer time of others.

HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

Smoke on the water, fire in the sky! Okay, maybe not that dramatic here but with the smoky haze from the Canadian wildfires our air quality has definitely changed this summer. The National Weather Service has issued air quality advisories for much of the East Coast many days this summer. When the levels are RED (really bad) or ORANGE (bad) people are advised to stay indoors and avoid outdoor activities. People with respiratory illnesses such as asthma, COPD, or allergies are especially advised to stay indoors. Using air conditioners and fans will keep you cool and make breathing easier. Air conditioner filters need to be checked and replaced more often as the smoke and fine ash particles will clog the filtering system. Gee, now we sort of know how Los Angeles residents feel with their smog. Remember to go out and smell the fresh air after a good rain as all the smoke and ash will have been washed away. It may be fun to try singing and dancing in the rain too!
