



THE STORY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names - Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption - from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's Assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as God's people. Since Mary best embodies

HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

Lions and tigers and bears! Oh my! As Dorothy, the Scarecrow and Tin Man were preparing for a disaster while walking through the forest following the yellow brick road we should also be prepared for a disaster. No one knows when a disaster may strike. So let's talk about the one disaster that everyone fears the most but hopes will never happen. FIRE! Do you have a fire escape plan? Do you and anyone in your house know where to meet outside the home? Do your children know how to call 911 and give your address? With only minutes to leave your home what would you take with you? In an area easily reached you should have a backpack or tote with at least three days worth of medication, a change of clothing and footwear for all the family, a first aid kit, a flashlight with extra batteries, an extra set of car keys, an extra pair of prescription eye glasses, special items for infants or disabled family members, and money. Don't forget to grab the family Bible too. Once the plan is in place don't forget about it. Practice it with your family at least twice a year about the same time you check your smoke alarm batteries. Check the emergency bag to be sure things inside are current. Remind everyone that under no circumstances are they to re-enter the house no matter what! Stuff can be replaced but a life cannot.

the people of both Old and New Testaments, her assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman's victory.

Furthermore, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul speaks of Christ's resurrection as the first fruits of those fallen asleep.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.

REFLECTION

In the light of the Assumption of Mary, it is easy to pray her Magnificat (Luke 1:46–55) with new meaning. In her glory she proclaims the greatness of the Lord and finds joy in God her savior. God has done marvels to her and she leads others to recognize God's holiness. She is the lowly handmaid who deeply reverenced her God and has been raised to the heights. From her position of strength she will help the lowly and the poor find justice on earth, and she will challenge the rich and powerful to distrust wealth and power as a source of happiness.



SUMMERTIME DRESS

Visitors to St. Peter's Basilica, the Sistine Chapel, or the Vatican Museums are required to abide by the official dress code, which requires that men wear long pants and shirts with at least short sleeves (no sleeveless shirts, no shorts.) Women in these locations may wear trousers, capri pants, skirts and dresses, however they cannot be shorter than knee length and shoulders must be covered. Bare shoulders and short skirts are not permitted. See www.papalaudience.org/dress-code. If this is the dress code at St. Peter's Basilica and the Sistine Chapel, it seems reasonable to abide by the same standards in our own church during Divine worship. By doing so, we show our respect for God as well as one another.


