#### THE HIDDEN KING: THE JEWISH ROOTS OF ST. JOSEPH

Many books on Saint Joseph focus on apocryphal legends & private revelations. In this Bible Study, Dr. Brant Pitre fo-

#### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

The Dobbs vs. Jackson Supreme Court decision sent the legality of abortion back to the States. The fight for life continues. Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen encouraged spiritual adoption of an unborn child, by praying that that one particular but unknown child's life be spared abortion and be allowed to live.

HOLY CHILD HEALTH MINISTRY will facilitate the Spiritual Adoption Program, beginning in September. At the end of nine months, we will host a baby shower as a visible means of imitating the Magi by providing assistance in the form of a donated baby item. These items will be given to the Heart of Tioga Pregnancy Center.

Our prayers CAN make a difference between whether a baby will be born or aborted. Our prayers can also be a form of spiritual support for both of the parents. Please share the love of life given to you by the Lord of all life and join in spiritually adopting a baby.



#### **HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES**

Dear!! Deer!! Buck!!! As we know, deer are most active at dusk & dawn. So as the fall weather approaches we need to be on high alert for those four legged vehicle crashers. Unfortunately, deer-vehicle collisions can happen to anyone at anytime, even in your own driveway (try explaining that to the insurance company). If you're driving by mountains (my backyard), woods (again my backyard) or agricultural fields (much of the county and my backyard) there are deer in and around these habitats. Take crossing signs seriously. Moderate your speed and avoid distractions, no texting allowed for sure. If you're about to hit a deer don't swerve! Hitting them will often do less damage than swerving into a ditch, electric pole, tree, or- worse- another car. Slow down & brake hard. Take care as fawns are more inquisitive about their surroundings and the rut will soon be starting. Avoid becoming a crash statistic like I had the unfortunate experience of becoming.


