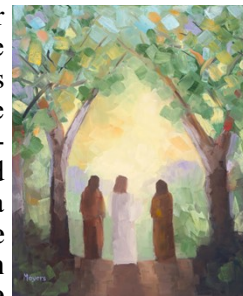

ABOUT FATIMA

Our Lady of Fátima is the title
given to the Virgin Mary as she
appeared before three shepherd
children, Lucia Santos and her
cousins, Jacinta and Francisco
Martó, near the village of Fátima,
Portugal, in 1917. She iden-
tified herself to them as the La-
dy of the Rosary. The Roman
Catholic Church officially rec-
ognized the Fátima events as
worthy of belief in 1930.



Our Blessed Mother urged all to pray constantly for the
conversion of sinners. Before he became Pope Benedict XVI,
then-Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger
said that **the central message
of Fatima is what the Church
has always taught: prayer,
penance, and conversion.** The
Church celebrates **October
13th** as the date of our Blessed
Mother's final public appear-
ance to the shepherd children of Fatima and the "Miracle of

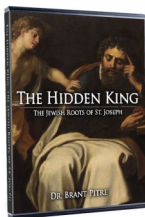

THE JEWISH ROOTS OF ST. JOSEPH

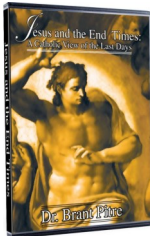

HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

It’s that time of year again—allergies are rampant, and with the kids back to school, germs are being passed around like candy on Halloween. How do we know if we have allergies (which are not contagious), or a virus, like the common cold or flu (which are contagious)? Common **allergy** symptoms include a stuffy or runny nose; sneezing; coughing; and itchy, red, or watery eyes. If you have a fever, you most likely have a bacterial or viral infection unrelated to allergies. Allergens typically include pollen, mold, dust mites, and pet dander. The **common cold virus** is usually diagnosed based on symptoms alone: runny nose, nasal congestion, and a sore throat. With a simple cold, if you rest and drink plenty of fluids, you’ll feel better in 5-7 days. **Flu virus** symptoms include: fever, headache, body aches and pains, fatigue, cough, chest pain, or shortness of breath; these can vary depending on the strain of virus. Fevers are more commonly associated with flu or Covid-19 viruses. **Covid-19 virus** infections can have no symptoms at all, though many people lose their ability to taste and/or smell, and the symptoms usually take longer to develop and longer to resolve than other viruses, like flu.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Month Two—Developing Baby...

The developing baby is now called a “fetus” (Latin for “little one”). She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips, and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks, all body systems are present. This little one can now suck her thumb and is about two inches long. Thank you for praying for this precious little baby!

LIFE CHAIN—SUNDAY OCTOBER 1ST—2:30-3:30 PM

Life Chain is an annual, peaceful, prayerful public witness of pro-life individuals standing in remembrance of the more than 65 million lives lost to abortion. Beginning in 1987, Life Chain has grown to over 1,000 cities and towns across North America. On the first Sunday in October, participants stand on designated local sidewalks for one hour to pray and hold pro-life signs. It is a powerful, solemn witness to thousands of motorists about the unconscionable killing of pre-born children. As a result of Life Chains, mothers have decided not to abort their children, saying "I couldn't get the 'Abortion Kills Children' message out of my mind."

This year, Life Chain Sunday is October 1st from 2:30 to 3:30pm. **We will gather at the intersection of Main Street and Route 6 in Mansfield.** Pro-life signs will be available. Bring a chair if you are unable to stand. See you there!
