HOMELESS SHELTER CONSTRUCTION- NEED VOLUNTEERS



Developing Baby... now called a "fetus" (Latin for "little one"). She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips, and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now func-



tioning, so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks, all body systems are present. This little one can now suck her thumb and is about two inches long. Thank you for praying for this precious little baby!

CONFIRMATION CLASS NOTES | A MATTER OF "INTENTION"

An *intention* is a spiritual desire we ask God to consider. It can be anything one would normally pray for; a friend's conversion, lives of unborn children, souls of departed loved ones, or even peace in our times. Rather than a simple prayer directly to God, or even a prayer that asks for intercession by Saints or Angels, an intention combined with a specific offering is considered very powerful. Just as we say a collection of prayers during a Rosary to encompass one prayer, the Mass is one prayer made up of many smaller prayers. This affords us several opportunities to focus on different intentions.

When we speak of *participating* in the Mass, many envision kneeling or standing at the right times, singing along with the choir, or reciting the prayers. All of this is true, but we as laity also participate in the "One Flesh" of Christ by offering ourselves as sacrifice alongside Jesus Christ. The sacrifice of Mass is not a reenactment, but a perpetuation of the one sacrifice. During the "Offertory", the priest says "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice *and yours* may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father" (emphasis added). We as part of the universal priesthood are able to mentally place our intention with the host to be blessed and prayed over by the priest.

After these *preparations* the actual sacrifice occurs in the Eucharistic prayer in concert with the consecration. At the consecration, Christ is present as the *whole body* of Christ; this has a powerful double meaning as we are all members of His body. We truly offer ourselves and all who are in a state of Grace along with His True Presence. Christ takes all of our personal offerings unto himself and to the Father; He shares in our cross as we share in His. We share our love with Him as He shares His love for us and with us; a very powerful opportunity to offer an intention *in communion* with our Lord.

Offering your Holy Communion to God as your intention is another traditional and appropriate way to lay that desire at the feet of our Lord, as you receive the Host or as you kneel in prayerful contemplation back at your pew. While it



might seem macabre to offer our sufferings—illness, mental anguish, or even our death—to God, it is a way to carry our intentions to Him, as we are reminded by Martyrs who carried a cause with them in their death.

Personal devotions are another opportunity to offer our intentions. Our Holy Mother Mary is a powerful intercessor; offering a special intention to accompany the recitation of a Rosary is a very good way to show the depth of the importance of your intention. Fasting and feast days can also be offered in focused contemplation towards a specific intention.

Spend time in reflection and discernment for your intentions, based on your calling and devotions. Some suggestions to start with... Pray for those discerning vocations to Religious life, such as the priesthood, or joining an order of nuns, friars, or monks. Pray for the reconciliation of the orthodox churches back to Rome. Pray for the unborn. One of my common intentions is for the soldiers in purgatory, especially if my offering can elevate one of them to their reward in Heaven. We should all make an effort to offer each Mass we attend for a special intention to further God's plan for all souls.


