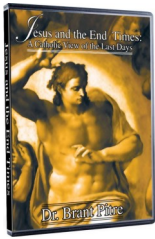

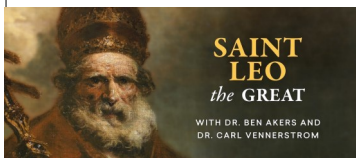

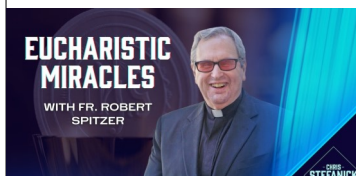

HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

Sleep and weight loss? Not in any way connected, right? Wrong! Your sleep habits and sleep patterns are very connected to weight loss and healthy living. Constant exposure to light disrupts sleep patterns and puts you at a much greater risk of weight gain. Not getting enough dark time each day also suppresses the sleep hormone melatonin. Now here’s the catch: Your body produces this sandman hormone only when it’s dark. Any light - whether it’s from the TV or the bathroom night light down the hall - will slow or stop the hormone production. Ever have trouble sleeping on a full moon night with moonlight streaming in the window through a crack in the curtains? Same thing. Blue light from your electronic devices is proving to be a major cause of fitful sleep. And after a bad night of sleep the first thing you want is something sweet to start your tired engines. See the weight gain pattern here? So, what to do? Some helpful hints include using room darkening curtains. Wearing a sleep mask to block out light. Place electronic devices in another room. Getting a good night’s sleep is essential in more ways than one. So, pleasant dreams!

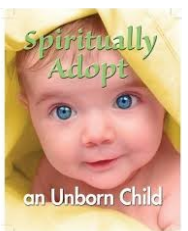

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION—MONTH THREE

Your baby is quite active in the womb now-although his mother won’t feel him for another couple of months. If his mother’s womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow, and move his tongue. He can make a tight fist if you touch his palm. He obtains the oxygen his body needs through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce. What a miracle he is!

WHY DOES GOD “ALLOW” FOR “BAD” THINGS TO HAPPEN?

God gives us free will. He gives us freedom to choose good or not. God cannot create humans with free will and then limit them to choosing good. C.S. Lewis said, “If you choose to say ‘God can give a creature free will and at the same time withhold free will from it,’ you have not succeeded in saying anything about God.” God wills only good for us (His Perfect Will), but He permits the consequences of our decisions (His Permissive Will).

Chaos exists in this world because of human free will. We are a fallen race. Being free to choose, humanity often turns away from choosing “good.” We choose “easy.” We choose sin. Few people make a conscious choice of “evil,” but we choose to justify our own brokenness. That brokenness has caused much of the pain and suffering in this world. Choosing against goodness, against holiness, against grace...leaves an opening for evil.



Animals don’t have the gift of free will, and are essentially run by their base instincts, reacting mindlessly to danger, hunger, and a desire to reproduce. It’s certainly not God’s *desire* for humans to act exclusively on base instinct, though it may bring at least temporary joy to the fallen.

We are in this world to explore God’s love. Those explorations often lead off the path of God’s desire for us. Luckily for us, this does not lead us away from God’s love but closer to it. Let me explain... God *desires* the best for us. He loves us more than we can know in this life. Our brokenness is not something He desires for us. He desires for us to be close to Him, to follow His will, and accept His Grace.

It’s difficult to understand God’s unconditional love for us. As children, we receive our parents unconditional love, but we may not understand the depth and fullness of it. I remember my father telling me as a young boy that he would gladly take on my illness for himself—a statement I have found myself echoing to my own children (though they may doubt my sincerity as, to them, it is an easy deal to make without means to make good on it...). My son Charles always responds, “I love you more than you love me!” when I tuck him in for the night.

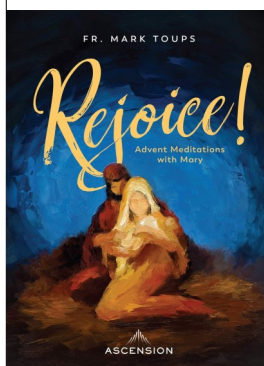
As recipients, we are unable to fully realize love poured out for us. I wish I could explain to my children how their pain is more painful to me than any pain I’ve experienced. I can pray for their understanding, but I expect that they—like me—will be unable to fully understand until they have families of their own, either as parents or as spiritual mothers or fathers if they choose the religious life.

How is it that I know my unconditional love for my children grows stronger every time it’s challenged, but I still cannot not wrap my mind around God’s love for me? If God is all-powerful and all-loving, why do bad things happen? To good people?

The simple fact is that we lack the adequacy to understand the fullness of God’s omnipotence. We can’t truly see the bigger picture. **God’s power allows him to bring goodness out of evil in ways we can’t comprehend.** Most who believe in God believe he did not create us or offer us salvation merely so we can live a carefree life in this world, but to prepare us for happiness in eternity with him in the next life. With His Grace, I will see you there.

A Psalm - Each day, you’re given a Psalm to pray (just as Mary would have prayed) to help you enter into prayer.

A reading - In reading Scripture, the Word of God brings you closer to Mary, who carried the Word in her body.

A prompt - Space is provided each day to journal. Record how the Lord is speaking to you this Advent.”
