THOU SHALT NOT KILL COMMIT MURDER

Last Sunday, our Confirmandi had some questions about the Fifth Commandment... *Are soldiers in war guilty of mortal sin?* This question has some nuance, even in Catholic theology. It is not a sin to take the life of an aggressor, in defense of self or others. A "Just War" is defined as a defensive war against grave evil and is fought because peaceful options have been exhausted. A Godly soldier avoids wanton destruction and thus avoids the mortal sin of murder *if* they engage in combat righteously and justly—that is, if they do their duty to avoid innocent death.

What about snipers (or any preemptive attack on an enemy soldier)? Some view this as unjust because it fails to give a "fighting chance" to the enemy. However, a preemptive attack— whether a sniper shot or an ambush—may still be in defense of life from an aggressor. For example, many such operations are carried out to prevent mines from being planted in civilian areas, villages from being victimized, and bases from being set up in areas that would increase civilian casualties.

Unfortunately, modern law often departs vastly from the Commandments laid out for us by God. Many countries outlaw self defense and allow murder of the unborn.

Why is it permissible to put an animal to sleep to save it from suffering? Why are we not allowed to assist in a "merciful" death of a loved one? God gave us authority over animals, to use them for food and companionship, and to manage their populations. We are expected to be merciful to the animals under our care and to provide a swift, painless end, if possible. We are not granted the same authority over humans... whether we are motivated by violence or mercy...

As the Confirmandi astutely pointed out, we never know God's plan. Maybe He intends to perform a miracle. Maybe we aren't actually near death. We should view suffering as a gift that draws us closer to Christ by sharing in his suffering. As difficult as **redemptive suffering** is to grasp or accept, it is important that we —and those close to us— look to Christ and pray to grow in understanding and respect for the possibility of good to come of our suffering, so that we are spiritually strengthened in times of sickness and dying. We can offer our suffering for the souls in purgatory. We are *not* required to suffer *heroicly* (when relief is available), but it is sinful to intentionally hasten death via dehydration or medication beyond what is required for pain relief.

So, both suicide and assisted suicide ("euthanasia" or "death with dignity") are considered mortal sins... is one worse than the other? This is a very nuanced subject because it depends on each person's particular circumstances. The Catechism is clear that, for mortal sin, these "three conditions must together be met": (1) "grave matter," (2) "full knowledge," and (3) "deliberate consent" (CCC 1857). Those who commit or assist in suicide may not be capable of consent due to the extreme emotional stress experienced at the time.

If murder is already a mortal sin, why does getting or assisting someone to get an abortion carry an excommunication? Jesus tells us that causing harm to children is one of the most heinous sins. Saying "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone hung around his neck and be drowned in the depths of the sea." (Matthew 17:6) *What is excommunication?* Excommunication is when we are censured from taking part in the communion of believers, the rites and sacraments of the church, and the rights of church membership, but is *not* removed from membership itself. It is not a banishment, but a "medicinal penalty" intended to invite the person to change behavior, repent, and return to full communion with the Church.

I continue to humbly try to reach these young members of our church. They *do* have questions, but modern society has quashed any comfort a child should have expressing their thoughts and concerns. Please pray for our Confirmandi to feel comfortable enough to ask questions and engage in dialog, and pray for me, brothers and sisters, that I may be able to answer them with the wisdom and grace necessary to keep them at home in the Church. \clubsuit Your Brother in Christ, ~Z.
