

HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES



Baby, it's cold out there! As Winter approaches, we all begin preparing for colder weather by dragging the mittens, hats, gloves, and heavy coats out of our closets. But what about our outdoor pets? Granted, there are some, like my horse, that I do not want to bring inside. So, what to do for our furry friends that must stay outdoors. First

of all, be sure they have a water source that is fresh and clean. Cold air will draw moisture from a body, making it harder to stay warm. Next, be sure your animals have a shelter that they can enter easily when rain or snow falls. Allow plenty of extra bedding to act as insulation to aid in maintaining warmth. Increasing their food, mainly proteins, during frigid weather will provide extra warmth also. Just as hibernating animals add a layer of fat to fight the cold weather, your pets need to do the same even though they don't sleep all winter. But remember that we do not need to add an extra layer of fat over the winter months to keep us warm! Darn, I knew there was a catch to the holiday eating I planned to do.





Adoration Chapel Opening and Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition






Saturday, November 25th and Sunday November 26th


