SPIRITUAL ADOPTION OF THE PREBORN—MONTH FIVE


Your spiritually adopted baby weighs over one pound now, and his mother can feel his movement. Before this time, he was too small for her to feel. Although he swam with ease in




John & Ann Kearns were part of Holy Child Parish for decades. John was an usher.





