
•What was Passover like at Jesus' time? • What did Peter & John do in Jerusalem to "prepare the Passover"?

#### HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

Ah, Spring is in the air, finally, I think maybe, not sure but hoping. Along with Spring comes a variety of outdoor activities and with that out come the reusable water bottles. We all know how vitally important water is to our lives. We've all heard about drinking the eight glasses of water daily and the health benefits derived from adequate hydration. But did you realize that your reusable environmentally friendly water bottle may be harboring harmful bacteria, mold and fungus. So what to do to avoid poisoning yourself.? At least once a day, take the bottle apart, wash everything in warm soapy water, and air dry thoroughly. Some bottles are not dishwasher safe so be sure to read any instructions that may come with the bottle. The straws need to be cleaned as well—use a long handled cleaning brush to remove any remnants of harmful bacteria, mold and fungi. If your bottle develops a foul odor or taste, it is contaminated and should be replaced. Remember to stay healthy and hydrated this Spring.


