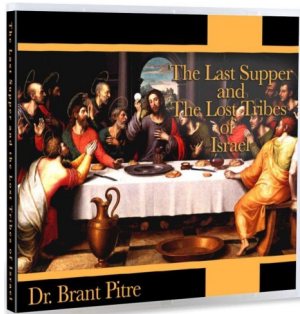

**NEW LECTIO BIBLE STUDY: THE LAST SUPPER & THE LOST TRIBES OF ISRAEL WITH DR. BRANT PITRE**



Please join us this Sunday following the 11:15 Mass for refreshments and Part One of this study.

All Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled the prophecies of the Old Testament in himself. Yet one of the most frequent prophecies in the Bible is that God would one day bring the “lost ten tribes” of Israel back home to the promised land. So how was this accomplished? Are

the ten tribes still lost, or did Jesus fulfill this prophecy too? Dr. Pitre takes something very familiar to Christians—the Last Supper—and ties it to something very mysterious—the return of the Lost Tribes of Israel.

- How is the Last Supper the key to Jesus’ fulfillment of this prophecy?

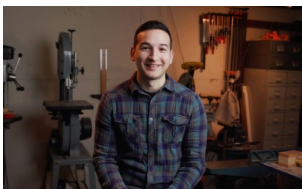

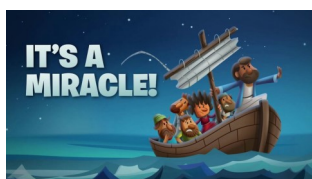
**MARY: THE CHURCH’S FIRST**

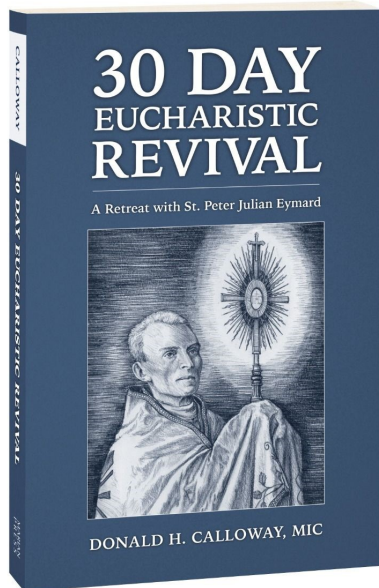
## 30-DAY EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL
