Obituary: Rev. Thomas Maloney

Rev. Thomas J. Maloney, pastor Emeritus of Our Lady of the Eucharist, Pittston, died Wednesday, June, 19, 2024, at Marywood Heights, Scranton, after having faithfully served the Diocese of Scranton for 59 years. Rev. Maloney, son of the late Thomas F. and Irene Woods Maloney, was born in Avoca on Oct. 23, 1939. A graduate of Scranton Preparatory School, he continued his education at St. Charles Seminary, Catonsville, Md. He completed his studies for the priesthood at St. Mary's Seminary and

University, Baltimore, Md., receiving a Bachelor of Arts in

philosophy in 1961 and a Bachelor of Sacred Theology in 1963. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 12, 1965, by Most Rev. Jerome D. Hannan, late Bishop of Scranton.

Rev. Maloney served as assistant pastor at St. Matthew's, East Stroudsburg, St. Mary's of the Immaculate Conception, Wilkes-Barre, and St. Rose Church, Carbondale. While serving in his capacity as assistant pastor at St. Mary's and St. Rose, he taught at St. Mary's High School, Wilkes-Barre, and St. Rose High School, Carbondale. During the Summers of 1967-72, he studied at Marywood College, Scranton, and Loyola University, Chicago, Ill., obtaining a Master's in religious education in February 1973.

In 1970, Rev. Maloney was appointed chaplain at Mercy Heights Hospital and director of religious formation at Bishop Hannan High School, Scranton. In 1972, he was appointed in residence at St. Mary's Assumption Church, Scranton, and director of religious formation at South Catholic High School/ Bishop Klonowski High School, Scranton. He was appointed principal at Bishop Klonowski High School, Scranton, in July 1978, and served until September 1980.

In 1980, Rev. Maloney was appointed pastor at Holy Child Church, Mansfield and also served as director of campus ministry at Mansfield University. In 1983, he was assigned as pastor at St. Ann's in Tobyhanna, and in 1985, as founding pastor of Our Lady of the Lake Church, Pocono Pines. In 1998, he was appointed pastor at Nativity of Our Lord Church in Scranton. In 2000, he was appointed pastor at Blessed Sacrament in Hughestown, and in 2007, at St. Mary's Assumption, Pittston and St. Mary, Help of Christians, Pittston; in 2010, these churches consolidated into the new parish of Our Lady of the Eucharist, Pittston, at St. Mary Help of Christian Church. He remained there until his retirement and appointment as pastor Emeritus in 2015. After retirement, he continued to serve the Diocese as administrator pro-tem of St. Elizabeth Parish, Bear Creek, in December 2015, and in May 2016 he was appointed sacramental minister.

He also served the Diocese as president, Board of Pastors, (1985-1987) at Pocono Central Catholic High School Canadensis and at Seton Catholic High School, Pittston (2003-2007). He served as spiritual director in the Diocesan Permanent Diaconate Formation Program (1995-2000) and on the Diocesan Presbyteral Council (2012-2015).

Rev. Maloney celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his ordination with a Pontifical Mass celebrated by the Most Rev. Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., J.C.L., Bishop of Scranton, on June 18, 2015. Rev. Maloney is survived by cousins, friends, parishioners and caregiver, Sister Mary Ann Cody, IHM. A Pontifical Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated by Bishop Bambera; burial in St. Mary's Cemetery, Avoca.
