#### HEALTH MINISTRY NOTES

Lions, tigers, and bears! Oh my! Ok so a walk in the woods may not present those dangers, but ticks and all the wonderful diseases they carry are a danger to you when taking a walk. With mild Winters, which I know we all



like, ticks are active longer and later in Autumn. Lyme disease is the most common tickborne illness. Prevention is key. Remove the tick by using tweezers and grabbing it at the head for fast and easy removal. The longer the tick is in contact with your skin, the greater the chance of disease transmission. Check your skin after every outing. Don't forget your furry friends, too! A bullseye rash may appear at the bite site within three to thirty days. Fever, chills, headaches, as well as muscle and joint pain are also common symptoms following a tick bite. If you have any of these symptoms, seek medical attention. Early treatment can prevent more lasting and debilitating effects. So, enjoy the outdoors, but be mindful of those little critters that can cause big problems.
