Health Ministry Notes

Prebiotics? Probiotics? Antibiotics? Why all the hub bub about these words and what do they mean? Well, let's start with some easy definitions. Prebiotics are usually found in high fiber foods and act as building blocks for the

micro flora of the gut. Probiotics are foods or supplements that contain live microorganisms intended to improve or maintain the good bacteria of the gut. Antibiotics are medication used to treat bacterial infections throughout the body. Antibiotics do not treat viral infections. Bacteria are living cellular organisms, antibiotics can destroy the living cell. Virus invade living cells and replicate inside the living cells. So with that information why all the fuss. With the over processing of foods and the ease of "fast foods", fiber has become lacking in many diets. Overuse and misuse of antibiotics causes a decrease in the absorption ability of the gut, as good bacteria are also destroyed. This causes diarrhea and a condition known as thrush. Thrush is an overgrowth of fungus, due to the micro flora imbalance. This veast infection often starts at the mouth and continues through the entire gut. Replacing the micro flora with prebiotics and probiotics helps the body correct itself. So eat healthy, enjoy fresh foods that contain plenty of fiber and natural nutrients and keep your gut happy. Remember the song that said, don't worry be happy. Enjoy the bounty of the season as Fall is fast approaching.




The book study will begin on September 16 and end on the 15th of October and is brought to you by the Marian Ministries.

Christians today have lots of different opinions about what "worship" should look like. Some think it should be all preaching, others think it should be 'entertaining', still others think it's all about the music. But what does the Bible say about worship? And why do Catholics do what they do at Mass? Why all the standing, sitting,



kneeling, and repetition? Where does it all come from? Many non-Catholics are confused by the rituals & words of the Mass; some even think the Mass is just 'made up'--a tradition of men. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Dr. Brant Pitre takes you on a scriptural tour of these topics:

- *The Shape of Worship:* Who determines how we worship? God or us?
- *The Meaning of Sacrifice*: Why did God demand animal sacrifice in the Old Testament? What was the meaning of blood sacrifice? Does it play a role in Christian worship?
- *The Tabernacle of Moses:* What did worship look like in the Old Testament? How does it parallel the Mass today?
- *The Book of Revelation:* What does worship look like in Heaven? How does Revelation reveal the Mass?
- The Jewish Passover: What was Passover worship like at the time of Jesus? Why was it so important, and how does it parallel Catholic worship today?
- *The Last Supper and the Death of Christ:* Why did Jesus choose to die during the Passover? How did his death fulfill the Jewish sacrifices in the Temple?


