


#### HEALTH MINISTRY—THANK YOU

#### Health Ministry—Notes

Achoo! God bless you! Or as those of us with German heritage will say, Gesundheit! When did this custom of blessing someone who sneezes begin? It all started with the Black Plague or Bubonic Plague. One form of the Black Death affected the respiratory tract and was so strong (virulent) that an infected person would have 'breakfast with their family and dinner with their ancestors.' 'Ring Around The Rosie' also came from the period of the plague. Let's jump to the 21st century and talk of respiratory viruses spread through droplets when someone sneezes, talks, or laughs. These respiratory viruses include RSV. SARS, Flu and Influenza, COVID, Chickenpox, and Shingles. What to do? Avoid contact with your nose, eyes and mouth. Wash your hands frequently with warm soapy water or use a hand sanitizer when soap and water are not readily available. If ill, remain home from work and school. And remember to cover your cough or sneeze by using the crook of your elbow. Should the illness last more than three or four days or the symptoms get worse seek medical attention. Stay healthy: exercise, eat a balanced diet, and get plenty of rest.
