FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD (FEBRUARY 2)

This Catholic feast day (February 2nd) has many names, including the feast of the Presentation of The Lord, the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, the feast of the Encounter, and Candlemas. Nomenclature aside, the feast celebrates the event recorded in Luke 2:22-38: Mary and Joseph's presentation of Jesus in the Temple.

According to the Mosaic law, a mother such as Mary who had given birth to a male child was considered unclean for 7 days; moreover, she was to remain "in the blood of her purification"—i.e., outside the temple—for 33 days more. If the woman had borne a daughter, the time that she was excluded from the sanctuary was doubled.

When that time (40 or 80 days) was over, the mother was to "bring to the temple a lamb for a holocaust and a young pigeon or turtle dove for sin"; if she was not able to offer a lamb, she was to take two turtle doves or pigeons; the priest prayed for her and so she was cleansed (Leviticus 12:2-8).



Forty days after the birth of Christ, Mary and Joseph obeyed the precepts of the law, and presented Jesus to the Temple. Simeon took Jesus into his arms and

said, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people, Israel."

Even before Christ's coming, and long after his ascension, nature knew of him — indeed, sun, moon, stars, and earth announce his mystery in concert, as it were. Today's liturgical calendar thus incorporates not only the historical facts of Christ's life — such as his incarnation in the womb of Mary, his birth in Bethlehem, his presentation in the Temple, and his Paschal Mystery — but also elements of God's own creation. ... Candlemas recalls this great mystery: that the light has come into the world (Dec. 25); that it grows in brightness even now (Feb. 2); until that day when it destroys darkness and death by its radiant beauty at the Easter vigil. This feast is an opportunity to focus on Jesus — the Light of the World — and His encounter with His Church.

Egeria, a fourth-century pilgrim to Jerusalem, was the first to describe this feast day, which spread over the centuries. The feast appears in Rome in liturgical books of the seventh and eighth centuries. Pope St. Sergius I was the first to prescribe a procession with candles, and the blessing of candles developed in Western and Central Europe during the early Middle Ages. Candlemas was celebrated as an octave in the Middle Ages and still today by religious orders whose special objective is the veneration of the Mother of God (Carmelites, Servites) and by many dioceses (Loreto, the Province of Siena, etc.). The blessing of candles and the procession take place at the beginning of the main Mass, setting the feast apart from most other liturgies.

This feast also marks the end of the Christmas cycle and a change in the Marian antiphon that concludes Compline (Night Prayer). Additionally, in 1997, Pope St. John Paul II chose this feast day to be the World Day of Consecrated Life, as the feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple "is an eloquent icon of the total offering of one's life for all those who are called to show forth in the Church and in the world, by means of the evangelical counsels, 'the characteristic features of Jesus – the chaste, poor, and obedient one' (Vita Consecrata, 1)".

Father Mandato is a Capuchin priest whose mother, Graziella DeNunzio Mandato, was a spiritual child of St. Padre Pio and wrote a memoir about him. Fr. Mandato was named after the saint and, like St. Pio, traces his roots back to the village of Pietrelcina in southern Italy. Fr. Mandato received his first Holy Communion from St. Padre Pio. His family migrated to America, and at 17 years old Fr. Mandato entered the Capuchins. He was ordained in 1985 and offered his first Mass at the same altar as St. Padre Pio. He became involved in hospital chaplaincy and developed a reputation for his devotion to the sick, like St. Pio. In 1998, Fr. Mandato began to lead a life of prayer and solitude as a missionary hermit in the Diocese of Scranton. He now takes breaks from the eremitical life to preach and offer healing Masses for the sick.



(younger people) or family medicine (all the rest) only gets paid about \$250,000 per year. But that doesn't cover malpractice insurance, continuing education costs, office overhead, and household expenses. So what does the graduating physician do? If they specialize, there is the possibility of a higher salary and more coverage for their additional expenses. So, how do I find a provider? 
