

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Following the Easter Season, which concluded with the Pentecost, the liturgy is marked by three solemnities of Our Lord: the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity; Corpus Christi; and finally; the following Friday, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Each of these days is part of the mystery of salvation from the Incarnation to the Resurrection and the Ascension and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

To better understand the Trinity, Pope Francis said to consider each name of the three persons of the Trinity, "which we pronounce every time we make the sign of the cross: Each name contains the presence of the other. The Father, for example, would not be such without the Son; likewise, the Son cannot be considered alone, but always as the Son of the Father. And the Holy Spirit, in turn, is the Spirit of the Father and the Son. In short, the Trinity teaches us that one can never be without the other. We are not islands, we are in the world to live in God's image: open, in need of others, and in need of helping others."



God "does not live in splendid solitude, rather he is an inexhaustible source of life that ceaselessly gifts itself and communicates."—Pope Benedict XVI

Pope Leo XIV recently stated, "It is in the Trinity that all things find their unity. This dimension of our Christian life and mission is close to my heart, and is reflected in the words of Saint Augustine that I chose for my episcopal service and for my papal ministry: *In Illo uno unum.* (*In the One, we are one.*) Christ is our Savior and in Him we are one, a family of God, beyond the rich variety of our

languages, cultures and experiences." The phrase is taken from Saint Augustine's Exposition on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

In a 2023 interview, then-Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost spoke about the significance of this motto: "Unity and communion are truly part of the charism of the Order of Saint Augustine, and also of my way of acting and thinking," he said. "I believe it is very important to promote communion in the Church."



Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms also offers a clear reflection of his Augustinian roots and the values he seeks to promote during his pontificate, particularly unity and communion within the Church.

The shield is divided diagonally into two sections. The upper half features a blue background with a white lily.

The lower half of the shield has a light background and displays an image that recalls the Order of Saint Augustine: a closed book with a heart pierced by an arrow. This is a direct reference to the conver-

sion experience of Saint Augustine himself, who described his personal encounter with God's Word using the phrase: *Vulnerasti cor meum verbo tuo*. (*You have pierced my heart with your Word*.)


