Mt. Saviour Monastery Friday, July 25th, 2025


All parishioners are invited to enjoy a quiet evening at Mt. Saviour Monastery in Pine City, NY. Car-



dinner & raffle are very popular, with many excellent and creative baskets every year. This is a fun and important fundraiser for our Parish. Stay tuned for details!














## MASS IN REMEMBRANCE OF VICTIMS OF VIOLENT OR TRAGIC DEATH

The Mass is scheduled for Thursday, July 24, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. in Saint Peter's Cathedral, 315 Wyoming Avenue, Scranton. All persons who have lost a loved one through tragic and traumatic death are invited to this liturgy. The Mass will be televised on CTV: Catholic Television and also by livestream on the diocesan website, www.dioceseofscranton.org.
