bers of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem.



Health Ministry Notes... Oh my aching joints! The "itis" brothers came to visit. You know them as arthritis, gout and bursitis. They are very busy as they travel from joint to joint. But there are some ways to stop and delay their pain, swelling and joint deformity. One of the easiest is to avoid certain foods that are known to cause inflammation in the joints. This includes members of the nightshade family. Vegetables such as peppers, tomatoes, eggplant and white potatoes. Foods high in sugar also cause joint inflammation. Foods to enjoy as they have ingredients that protect joints include asparagus, eggs, garlic and onions. Increasing your daily fiber is another way that has been shown to slow down the effects of joint inflammation. Exercise is another way to slow the damage from arthritis. Joints that don't move often will become "frozen "and may require surgery to regain their mobility. You do not need to do jumping jacks, weight lifting and other



strenuous exercises, there are exercises that can be done in a chair that gets all your joints moving without the impact. So this fall get moving, enjoy the changing season and tell the "itis" brothers to find somewhere else to live.






