

EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS (SOLEMNITY)

September 14th



What does the Exaltation of the Cross mean?

The Council of Trent emphasizes the unique character of Christ's sacrifice as "the source of eternal salvation" and teaches that "His most holy Passion on the wood of the cross merited justification for us." And the Church venerates His cross as she sings: "Hail, O Cross, our only hope" (CCC 617).

Why do we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

This solemn Feast celebrates the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, but it also commemorates two historical events: (1) The discovery in 320 AD of the True Cross, of Calvary, and of the tomb of Christ, by St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine. (2) The dedication of a church on the site in 335 AD. Today, this church, in continuous existence since then, is known as the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher, and houses the Calvary, the Tomb of Jesus, and the cistern in which St. Helena found the instruments of the Passion, including the Cross.

More about St. Helena

Sometime after her son's reign (Emperor Constantine) began, she converted and sought to find the place where the Lord died and was buried. Going to Jerusalem she obtained the assistance of the Bishop of Jerusalem, St. Macarius, who informed her of the local tradition that the Temple of Venus sat on the spot. Having it torn down, she found underneath, the places of the crucifixion and burial of Jesus, and the instruments of His Passion.

What does Jesus say about the Cross?

Prior to His Crucifixion, Our Lord spoke of His death on the Cross several times to His disciples, first in allusions, and then directly.

- Matthew 10:37–38 He who loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; he who loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; he who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.
- Matthew 16:24 If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.
- Matthew 20:18–19 Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death, and deliver him to the Gentiles to be mocked and scourged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day.
- Matthew 26:2 You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of man will be delivered up to be crucified.

What is the spiritual meaning of the Cross?

The Cross represents the truth that Jesus sacrificed Himself for the sins of the world. Sadly, many people reject Jesus and His Cross. St. Paul says,

• 1 Corinthians 1:18-25. For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the cleverness of the clever I will thwart."

What does the "INRI" on crucifixes mean?

In keeping with Roman crucifixion practices, Pilate had Christ's name and 'crime against Rome' nailed to the cross as a warning to others. "INRI" stands for the Latin words "Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum" (Jesus of Nazareth King of the Jews). This 'titulum' was among the items St. Helena discovered in Jerusalem, and it is preserved with other relics of the Passion in the Church of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, in Rome.

• John 19:19 Pilate also wrote a title and put it on the cross; it read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews."

Where is the cross of Jesus kept?


Significant pieces of the Cross are kept in Rome at the Church of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem. Over the centuries, a great many fragments have also been distributed as holy relics, to churches and to individuals.

Why is the Cross venerated?

The Cross is venerated—as the historical reality spoken of in Scripture, as a relic of wood, or as a physical representation of the image of Christ—solely because of Who was crucified on it, and what He accomplished by means of it. By itself it is, as St. Paul wrote, a scandal and foolishness. EWIN

OUR LADY OF SORROWS (MEMORIAL)

September 15th



Our Lady of Sorrows is a title for Mary, recalling the **Seven Sorrows** she endured during Jesus' life, passion, & death.

When we contemplate Mary's suffering, we receive grace and spiritual enlightenment to help us understand the depth of Jesus' sacrifice and Mary's role in it. The Congregation of the Holy Cross considers Our Lady of Sorrows their principal patron and model of hope and faithfulness.

Paintings of the seven sorrows are displayed in the main stairwell of Holy Child Church. There, you will also find copies of a booklet explaining how to pray the Seven Sorrows devotion, and the connection to our Lady's appearance at Kibeho, Rwanda in Africa in the 1980s. Please take a copy!

bers of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem.




THE BOY FROM MILAN





REPORTING ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. Per the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour "Childline" Child Abuse hotline 1-800-932-0313 or www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
