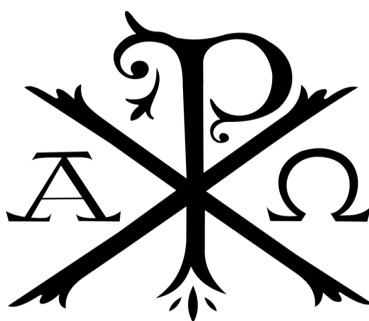

The De Profundis (Psalm 129/130)

The *De Profundis* (“of the depths”) is the famous Psalm 130 of anguish and sorrow for sins, set to music by many great composers. It is a penitential psalm that is used by the Roman Catholic Church, sung as part of Vespers (evening prayer), in Masses for the dead, **in prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory** (the Church Suffering), and to express remorse for our faults to Christ, a beautiful expression of repentance.

Out of the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord:
Lord, hear my voice.

Let Thy ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication.
If Thou, O Lord, wilt mark iniquities:
Lord, who shall stand it?

For with Thee there is merciful forgiveness:
and by reason of thy law, I have waited for Thee, O Lord.
My soul hath relied on His word,
my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

From the morning watch even until night,
let Israel hope in the Lord.

Because with the Lord there is mercy:
and with him plentiful redemption.

And he shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

V/. Lord, hear my prayer.

R/. And let my cry come unto Thee.

V/. Let us pray. O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful; grant to the souls of Thy servants departed the remission of all their sins, that by our devout supplications they may obtain that pardon which they have always desired. Who livest and reignest world without end.

R/. Amen.

V/. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R/. And let perpetual light shine upon them.

V/. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

MEMORIALS & FEASTS IN THE COMING WEEK

On Monday, the Church celebrates the **Memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary**. She died in 1231 at age twenty-four. She was the wife of Louis IV of Thuringia and a mother of three. As a widow, she became a tertiary Franciscan, dedicated to the needs of the poor and the sick. Canonized only four years after her death, she is known as the patroness of the Franciscan Third Order and of Catholic charities.



Canon Law defines Third Orders as "associations whose members, while living a secular life, strive after Christian perfection by observing a papally approved rule, under the direction and spirit of a religious order" (Canon 702). Although members, sometimes called tertiaries, are not bound by public vows, they are fully members of a religious family.

Entry into a Third Order requires spiritual discernment and a proscribed period of formation, followed by a formal profession that includes promises or vows.

Third Orders are comprised of lay men and women who are formally associated with a religious order such as the Benedictines, Augustinians, Carmelites, Dominicans, Franciscans, Mercedarians, Norbertines, Servites, Marists, and Trinitarians and who may or may not live in community (Third Order Regular versus Third Order Secular). Third Order Regulars take vows, while Third Order Seculars make a solemn promise, which distinguishes them from members of confraternities.

On Friday, the Church celebrates the **Memorial of the Presentation of Mary**. This Memorial finds its origins in a 2nd century apocryphal source, the Protoevangelion or Book of James, and in the dedication of the basilica of St. Mary the New in Jerusalem on November 21, 543.

According to tradition on this day, Mary, at the age of 3, was presented in the temple by her parents St. Ann and St. Joachim, and her life was consecrated to God.

The Church wants to emphasize not so much the historical event in itself, of which there is no trace in the Gos-

pels, but the total gift that Mary made of herself, by listening: "Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and observe it" (Lk. 11:28). This experience prepared the young girl from Nazareth to become the "temple of the Son of God".

For this Memorial, the liturgy proposes the passage from Matthew that speaks about how we are "related" to Jesus. It is a relationship not formed by blood, but by imitation: "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother, and sister, and mother". To become a member of "His family", one must do so not by blood or belonging to a particular religion. Rather, it is a free and personal choice that translates into a commitment to do the will of the Father.

Accordingly, Jesus Himself said this in reply to a woman who was praising His Mother: " 'Blessed is the womb that carried you and the breasts at which you nursed.' He replied, 'Rather, blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it.' " Mary is the woman who knows how to listen, who knows how to contemplate, who knows how to refer everything to her Son - "Do whatever He tells you" (Jn. 2:5). Mary is the One who never abandoned her Son Jesus, not even along the way of the Cross.

All of this can help us imitate the Virgin Mary. Every Christian is called to look at Mary so as to learn from her, to entrust themselves to her intercession and to guard the "purity of the faith" against any idols that surround us.

The cycle of these three Marian feasts: the Birthday of Our Lady (September 8), the Holy Name of Mary (September 12) and her Presentation in the Temple (November 21), parallel the first three feasts of our Lord in the liturgical cycle: the birth of Christ or Christmas (December 25), the Holy Name of Jesus (January 3), and His Presentation in the Temple (February 2).

U.S. Bishops Issue “Special Message” on Immigration

November 12, 2025

As pastors, we the bishops of the United States are bound to our people by ties of communion and compassion in Our Lord Jesus Christ. We are disturbed when we see among our people a climate of fear and anxiety around questions of profiling and immigration enforcement. We are saddened by the state of contemporary debate and the vilification of immigrants. We are concerned about the conditions in detention centers and the lack of access to pastoral care. We lament that some immigrants in the United States have arbitrarily lost their legal status. We are troubled by threats against the sanctity of houses of worship and the special nature of hospitals and schools. We are grieved when we meet parents who fear being detained when taking their children to school and when we try to console family members who have already been separated from their loved ones.

Despite obstacles and prejudices, generations of immigrants have made enormous contributions to the well-being of our nation. We as Catholic bishops love our country and pray for its peace and prosperity. For this very reason, we feel compelled now in this environment to raise our voices in defense of God-given human dignity.

Catholic teaching exhorts nations to recognize the fundamental dignity of all persons, including immigrants. We bishops advocate for a meaningful reform of our nation’s immigration laws and procedures. Human dignity and national security are not in conflict. Both are possible if people of good will work together.

We recognize that nations have a responsibility to regulate their borders and establish a just and orderly immigration system for the sake of the common good. Without such processes, immigrants face the risk of trafficking and other forms of exploitation. Safe and legal pathways serve as an antidote to such risks.

The Church’s teaching rests on the foundational concern for the human person, as created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:27). As pastors, we look to Sacred Scripture and the example of the Lord Himself, where we find the wisdom of God’s compassion. The priority of the Lord, as the Prophets remind us, is for those who are most vulnerable: the widow, the orphan, the poor, and the stranger (Zechariah 7:10). In the Lord Jesus, we see the One who became poor for our sake (2 Corinthians 8:9), we see the Good Samaritan who lifts us from the dust (Luke 10:30–37), and we see the One who is found in the least of these (Matthew 25). The Church’s concern for neighbor and our concern here for immigrants is a response to the Lord’s command to love as He has loved us (John 13:34).

To our immigrant brothers and sisters, we stand with you in your suffering, since, when one member suffers, all suffer (cf. 1 Corinthians 12:26). You are not alone!

We note with gratitude that so many of our clergy, consecrated religious, and lay faithful already accompany and assist immigrants in meeting their basic human needs. We urge all people of good will to continue and expand such efforts.

We oppose the indiscriminate mass deportation of people. We pray for an end to dehumanizing rhetoric and violence, whether directed at immigrants or at law enforcement. We pray that the Lord may guide the leaders of our nation, and we are grateful for past and present opportunities to dialogue with public and elected officials. In this dialogue, we will continue to advocate for meaningful immigration reform.

As disciples of the Lord, we remain men and women of hope, and hope does not disappoint! (cf. Romans 5:5)

May the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe enfold us all in her maternal and loving care and draw us ever closer to the heart of Christ.
